

AIA San Francisco Integrated Project Delivery Award

Introduction:

Owners throughout the United States are demanding that architects, engineers and the building industry collaborate in the development of a new model for delivering buildings. Integrated Practice allows architects to design, collaborate and facilitate the virtual construction process, reducing actual construction costs and delivering projects efficiently. The creation of an integrated project team early in the process is the optimal environment for buildings to be designed and delivered with certainty. Awards will be given to projects in two categories: built and unbuilt. Unbuilt project submittals can be either a project not yet completed or an analysis or simulation.

This award seeks to highlight:

- Projects and processes, not technology demonstrations
- Teams, not individuals

Criteria:

Each entry in the AIA San Francisco Design Awards program is judged on the success with which it has met its individual requirements. Entries are weighed individually, not in competition with others. Criteria include quality of design; resolution of the program or idea; and innovation, thoughtfulness, and technique.

All entries must also include detailed information about the sustainable aspects of the project. The AIA defines sustainability as the concept of meeting present needs without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. Sustainable design is achieved through an integrated design and delivery process that enhances the natural and built environment by using energy sensibly with a goal toward carbon neutrality, improves air and water quality, protects and preserves water and other resources, and creates environments, communities and buildings that are livable, comfortable, productive, diverse, and safe. *Sustainability is not the sole criterion on which projects will be judged.*

Built entries will be judged on the following:

- Development of a new design or delivery process or innovation using Building Information Modeling (BIM) software
- Pilot projects that demonstrate new collaborative methods that can serve as a model for the industry
- Quantified benefits in efficiency and quality
- Protection of design intent with reduced delivery costs
- New forms of collaboration/partnership
- If a Building Information Model (BIM) is used, its success in creating outstanding architecture through the software

Unbuilt entries will be judged on the following:

- Success in development of a new design or delivery process or innovation using Building Information Modeling (BIM) software
- Pilot programs that demonstrate new capabilities or processes using virtual Building Information Modeling (BIM)
- Academic studies and research projects employing BIM to achieve gains in productivity, efficiency, sustainability or design intent realization.
- Creative use of BIM for analysis and/or simulation, including, but not limited to: urban design, project and program phasing, energy, air flows and indoor environments
- New forms of collaboration or partnering

Eligibility:

- **Bay Area projects:** All architects and designers practicing within the United States are eligible to submit projects that are located in the immediate Bay Area; defined here as any location within a 30-mile radius of the AIA San Francisco office.

OR

- **Bay Area architects:** All architects and designers practicing within the immediate Bay Area, defined as any location within a 30-mile radius of the AIA San Francisco office, are eligible to submit projects located outside the Bay Area. If a firm has multiple offices, only projects executed by the Bay Area offices are eligible.
- Any architect, designer, or architecture firm falling into one of the above categories may submit any number of eligible entries provided each is submitted separately with separate payments.
- Projects that have won awards in other awards programs are eligible unless they were previously honored by AIA San Francisco. **EXCEPTION:** *All previous unbuilt winners are eligible to resubmit in a built category once the project has been completed.*
- Any number of projects can be entered regardless of project size, budget, style, or building type and may include remodeling or extended use projects.
- Work by the firm of a design professional serving as a juror is ineligible.
- Construction must have been completed after January 1, 2006.

Submission Packet:

Please include your digital files **in the following order**. File names should not include your firm name.

Built Projects:

- **50-word summary (Microsoft Word File):** 50-word summary should be approximately two sentences on the project. Copy should be clear, concise and well written, as it may be reproduced in print publications.
- **One-page summary (Microsoft Word File):** Summary should fully outline the program and design objectives and how the project addressed these objectives.
- **Integrated Project Delivery summary (Microsoft Word File):** Describe performance elements for the project and strategies incorporated in the final design and or construction to achieve them. Refer to the submitted drawings and diagrams as appropriate. (1500 words maximum)
- **UNBUILT ENTRIES ONLY Academic Program or Analysis and Simulation Summary (Microsoft Word File):** Describe the objectives and goals. Include diagrams, photographs and other relevant information for your project or program. (1500 words maximum)
- **Sustainable Design Supplement:** Include information indicating how your project addressed environmental objectives. [CLICK HERE FOR WORKSHEET](#)
- **Site Plan (JPEG format):** Show context and include North arrow.
- **Floor Plans (JPEG format):** Include North arrow.
- **Sections/Elevations (JPEG format):** optional; maximum two.
- **Images (JPEG format):** Up to 8 images of the completed project. Artwork should be saved to 8"x10" JPEGs at 300 dpi RGB.
- **Design Team Spreadsheet (Microsoft Excel File):** This is for office use only. It will not be shown to the jury. [CLICK HERE FOR TEMPLATE](#)

How to Submit:

AIA San Francisco is moving to an electronic registration process. **You must preregister** at <http://designawards.eventbrite.com>. If you are submitting multiple projects, you will need to preregister each project separately. A copy of your confirmation email(s) must be included with your submission packet.

System requirements: Only compatible with PCs running Internet Explorer. You cannot upload files using Safari or Firefox browsers at this time.

- Free Full-time Architectural or Design Students with ID

Entry fees are nonrefundable.

Awards Presentation, Exhibition and Publications:

- Winning projects will be announced at the AIA San Francisco Design Awards Gala in May.
- Winning projects will be featured in *California Home + Design*.
- All entries are considered for inclusion in top, national design publications.
- Winning firms are required to submit appropriate authorization for use of any photographs and drawings for publicity purposes.
- Each winning team will be asked to identify a contact for the media.
- Winning firms will assume all exhibition printing costs.
