ARE Pact 2024 - Path B FAQs

Q: If I only have a few exams left, is it worth it for me to enroll in the program?

A: This is totally up to you. Perhaps the program is exactly what you need to motivate and pass those last 1, 2, or 3 tests. However, you will be expected to follow the schedule with the rest of the participants. Therefore, it may not make sense if your remaining exams are Building Systems and/or Building Design and Construction Systems, since those are the last two exams in our scheduled program. Participants who have already passed 1-6 exams would have the option to act as a mentor/tutor to the people in their group who still need to pass.

Q: What if I only have 2 exams left to complete? Do I still need to put down the \$1,000 enrollment fee? If so, what if I pass my remaining exams in 2 months—when will I receive my refund?

A: Yes, no matter how many exams you have left to complete, you will still need to pay the \$1,000 enrollment fee. That being said, as soon as you pass your remaining qualifying exams, we will refund your money upon receipt of your test verification forms.

Q: What if I don't pass all the exams within the 24 month program timeline?

A: If you do not pass all required exams before the program deadline, you will receive a portion of your \$1,000 enrollment fee equivalent to the percentage of the qualifying exams that you did pass during that period. The whole point of the program is to motivate you, so we will be very strict about this policy. Exceptions can be made for personal emergencies.

Q: How do I prove that I have passed an exam?

A: When you complete exams, your online NCARB dashboard is updated with the results. All that you need to do is screenshot this page send that to AIASF.

Q: What if I can't get a test scheduled in time for the 3/31/26 deadline?

A: Exams can be scheduled 6 months out. Participants can schedule at the last minute (2 business days in advance) for their exams; however, you risk not being able to get a space if the testing center is already full. In other words, there really is no excuse for not scheduling your tests in a timely manner. In addition, the schedule allows for two extra months each program year for those who encounter scheduling conflicts. As long as your most recent passed exam receipt has the date 3/31/2026 or earlier, you will qualify for a refund. You will have to wait until we receive your documentation, however, before we process your reimbursement.
